The Chair opened the meeting at 7:30pm.

A reminder to everyone that the meeting was being recorded for accurate writing of the minutes.

6405	<u>Apologies and consent to acceptance for absence</u> Apologies requiring consent received from Councillor Steve Murrow. Councillor Paul Stannard not present, no apologies received. Other apologies received not requiring consent from PC Scott Cameron.	
6406	<u>To receive member's declaration of interest and dispensations relating to items in this agenda.</u> None were received.	
6407	<u>To resolve that the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday 14th July 2026 are a true and correct record.</u> Draft Minutes were circulated to Councillors and available on the Parish Council Website following the meeting. Councillor French advised that there needed to be an amendment to 6400, Cheenie's first name is Katrina and not Karen. This is the only amendment required. 6408	<u>Progress reports for information</u> a. Chair's report Nothing to report at this b. Clerk's progress report on previous agenda items (Appendix E) The inclusive picnic bench from Sutcliffe Play has increased in price since we bought the last 2. With a discount of £498.00, the bench will cost £2241.00 + vat, delivered. Not installed. Stuart would be happy to install. Cost of post mix and his time to be factored in. 8 – 10 week lead time. £1000.00 was given by Cllr Waldron some time ago towards this. Please advise if you want to proceed. Price received after Agenda produced. Can be added to October if you wish. Still trying to get there with the Export of the electricity and working with the electricity supplier to finalise all the required details. A meter exchange has taken place at the Parish Hub and the Export Team have confirmed they now have everything in place to begin recording the exported power. Correspondence has been received from a resident at Rainbows End, Wilde Street regarding the trees on the opposite side of the road, one of which fell across the road, blocking it. Highways have confirmed they are not responsible for the trees and they must therefore be on private land. UKPN have confirmed they will cut the trees below the wires as they are running through cables. Any help confirming ownership would be helpful. . Following the introduction of an amendment to the Localism Act 2011 under the English Devolution and Community Empowerment Act 2026, and with the aim of improving councillor safety, local authorities are no longer required to publish the home addresses of elected or co-opted members in their public registers of interest from 29 June 2026. Where applicable, home address details are still to be declared to the Clerk and Monitoring Officer, retained internally and used to manage potential conflicts of interest, but they will no longer be available for public inspection unless the member has requested otherwise in writing to the Monitoring Officer. Cllr Waldron can provide some funding towards Village Gateways. If some costs can be prepared and a licence from Suffolk Highways obtained, which is valid for 12 months, an application towards the costs can then be made. Several reports have been made to me regarding the use of a motorbike on the Toc-H land which has caused quite a lot of damage to the ground as it was again used after the rain. This has now been reported to the police and a crime reference number obtained. Stuart	

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b.	Squadron Leader Owen Crossby – RAF Mildenhall There has been an increase in queries recently related to the Sunnica Energy Farm development, so I would like to clarify the position of RAF Mildenhall and the Ministry of Defence (MOD). The MOD was a consultee during the statutory planning consultation process for the proposed development of Sunnica. The MOD reviewed the proposals to determine if there would be any impact on Defence and raised no objection to the proposed Sunnica Energy Farm consultation. The MOD was also involved in the planning stage, and officials have reviewed the planning criteria for the proposed solar farm and are content that MOD's interests were considered and protected. As a result, the department's decision to not object to the energy farm remains unchanged. I can assure you that as part of this process, the relevant Subject Matter Experts were engaged, and no objections to the solar farm were raised by any party, which included the users of the nearby MOD sites. The MOD cannot object to developments just on the possibility that there may be an impact to Defence activities should a specific chain of events occur. The Chief Constable of the Ministry of Defence Police visited RAF Mildenhall to see the constables that work here and get a feel for their daily routine. He also discussed counter-drone defensive operations with the US security personnel and leadership. RAF Mildenhall hosted a clergy day, with representatives from a variety of religious denominations from around the region meeting with the on-base Chaplains to discuss the Spiritual pillar of support to Airmen. The same day, we also hosted a Key Leaders Day to explain the operational role of the base and the units that call it home. There was attendance from County Councils, local government, and emergency services. Invites for this year's Mil-D-Con event have been sent to local cadets and schools. As these were sent out when schools were closed, please let us know if any invites appear to have been mislaid. The US Labor Day holiday was on 7 September, so there was reduced activity at the base last weekend. An exercise was held to rehearse procedures for reacting to a protest at the base main entrance last week. Apologies that this was not notified to the community in advance, but it was not well notified internally, and we were not aware of the exercise. This has been fed into the lesson learned from the exercise.	
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c.	PC Scott Cameron – Community Policing Nothing significant to report other than the following relevant incidents over the past 28 days in your local area: 3 x criminal damages reported including the recent damage to the park where motorbikes have caused damage to the grassed area. 2 x burglaries - Both residential dwellings 1 x Going equipped - Suspect was stopped in vehicle and items found in the vehicle indicating there was intent to steal. Suspect was arrested and interviewed. Currently still under investigation. I have only covered a select few of the crimes recorded above. There are more, however mainly isolated incidents that are not in the public interest. Recent engagement on RAF Lakenheath regarding vehicle issues. Nothing significant to report on this. There will be another engagement on RAF Mildenhall soon. Dates to be confirmed. Now that the summer demand is over, I will hopefully be available for the next meeting.

The most recent report is showing an improved position with repairs. The zip wire is now back in operation and signed off by Creative Play. The Clerk and the Parish Keeper continue to work on repairs that can be carried out. The new picnic bench will be purchased and installed inside the gated play area. The Parish Keeper will do this. Further items will be looked at for that area in due course. The new upright

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	timbers on the zip wire will be monitored. The chain may need links removing to increase ground clearance. The play inspector contacted the Clerk while on site regarding the damage to the land from motorbike use. A crime reference number has now been obtained by the Clerk.	
6413	<u>To discuss plans, representatives and timings for Remembrance Sunday, 8th November 2026 and Saturday 7th November 2026</u> The timings will be Saturday 7th November, 11.00am at Kenny Hill. Cllr Waldron has confirmed he will be able to attend. Sunday 8th November, 10.30am at the War Memorial, Lamble Close followed by 11.00am at the War Graves, St John's Church. Cllr Waldron will attend the War Graves on the Sunday. The Clerk will let West Row Parish Council know our timings as well as Kenny Hill Baptist Church and RAF Mildenhall. Cllr Peachey will be in attendance and all Parish Councillors are encouraged to attend. The Commonwealth War Graves in Beck Row are the largest in the County with a total of 78 war graves.	Clerk
6414	<u>To discuss number of and resolve the purchase of Christmas trees for 2026</u> It was resolved to proceed as in previous years with the same number of trees from Rougham Nurseries. Ideally delivery should be arranged to allow for them to be put up on the last Saturday in November, this being 28th November 2026.	Clerk
6415	<u>To review the Parish Council participation and findings from the Community Action Day</u> Cllr Peachey thanked Cllr Bailey, Cllr Haylock and Cllr Howard for their attendance. The day was organised by Clarion Housing to encourage connection and community engagement. The Clerk organised litter pickers and equipment for the day and liaised with Diane from Clarion. Several organisations attended. Families took part in litter picking the area. Clarion had organised a skip for the site as well as a free ice cream van for the children. The Parish Council provided craft activities and the business style cards suggested by Cllr Vickerage proved useful and were handed out. PC Scott Cameron was in attendance. The residents are looking for support to urge Clarion to create a designated play area for the children. Currently there are issues regarding the use of the green space for football as cars, properties and trees have ended up damaged. The damage caused to the planted trees have meant the area now looks quite empty as the trees were damaged beyond repair.	

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	District Cllr Waldron has been to look at the site in question. He would be happy to support the project with a grant from his locality budget towards goals or a lawn mower. Clarion Housing own the land so there is nothing of significance the Parish or West Suffolk Council can do beyond showing their support. The Parish Council would also be willing to receive a grant request towards the purchase of football goals or such like if Clarion Housing give permission for the use of the land.	
6416	<u>To resolve the approval of the National Joint Council for Local Government Services (NJC) new pay scales for 2026-27 and to approve back pay from 01 Apr 26</u> Employers are encouraged to implement this pay award as swiftly as possible. Councillors resolved to approve the new pay scales and authorise the back pay from 01 Apr 26.	
6417	<u>To discuss 3 questions to put to Suffolk Highways representative at a future meeting</u> Cllr Waldron has arranged for Suffolk Highways to attend a future meeting and answer a few questions that the Parish Council deem relevant to the area. Discussion was had and the following questions have been suggested. These may be subject to change. It is hoped that attendance could be at the October 2026 meeting. Question 1 – To confirm the ownership and responsibility for repair and maintenance of Rookery Drove and what is going to happen about all the Drovers that are now without owners. Question 2 – To appeal for improved line markings and signage in this area as currently in a very poor order, repairs are not lasting and we have faded or missing signs with line markings that are faintly in place if at all. Question 3 – To ask when the temporary 30mph speed limit on the A1101 between Kenny Hill and Shippea Hill will be lifted and brought back to the 50mph limit. There have been roadworks signs in place for 3 years. Are any roadworks planned in the foreseeable future?
